





EXISTING TELEHEALTH POLICY

Much of the telehealth policy that exists revolves around reimbursement. The elements that usually make up the policy is based on who, what, where and how.





MEDICARE TELEHEALTH POLICY

The Medicare policy on the use of technology to provide services is in two buckets

REIMBURSEMENT REQUIREMENTS FOR PRIVATE PAYERS



42 states and DC

have telehealth **private payer** laws

Some go into effect at a later date.

Parity is difficult to determine:

Parity in services covered vs. parity in payment

Many states make their telehealth private payer laws "subject to the terms and conditions of the contract"

- •DEA PHE prescribing exception/allowed phone for suboxone for OUD
- •HIPAA OCR will not fine during this time



MEDICAID ISSUE	CHANGE
Modality	Allowing phone
Location	Allowing home
Consent	Relaxed consent requirements
Services	Expanded types of services eligible
Providers	Allowed other providers such as allied health pros
Licensing	Waived some requirements

- Private payer orders range from encouragement to cover telehealth to more explicit mandates
- Relaxed some health information protections
