

## QUICK GLANCE STATE TELEHEALTH ACTIONS IN RESPONSE TO COVID-19 (April 9 – 5 pm PT)

Please note this document is meant to be a quick overview of certain state actions. Details related to those actions are not captured in this chart and some states did not need to take action during COVID-19 to update their policies (EX: having a pre-COVID-19 policy that already allowed the home to be an eligible originating site).
